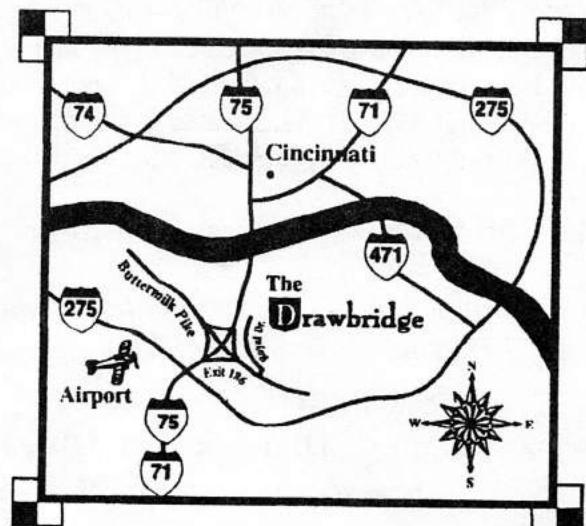

"I met **Russell Mayer**, a veteran of the 508 on November 2, 2002 at a meeting of the Washington, D.C. Chapter of the 82nd Abn. He had never heard of the 508 PIR Association.

Russell was a medic in Hq 2nd. He jumped into Holland with the 508 and fought in the Bulge.

From George Stoeckert (HQ !st):

The Washington Post dated **June 6, 2002** tells how **Prétot**, a village of 500 dedicated **Place Colonel Mendez** as a tribute to Colonel Louis G. Mendez who commanded the 3rd Battalion of the 508 Parachute Infantry Regiment in the battle which liberated the little village on June 20, 1944. Colonel Mendez earned the Distinguished Service Cross, the nation's second highest military honor for his leadership in this action.

Jeannie Mendez, accompanied by eight of their twelve children, seven of the spouses and nine grandchildren were honored by the people of Prétot, both young and old, some of whom still had memories of that day on which they were liberated.

Among veterans of the 508 present at the ceremony was Tom Porcella (H Co) who had participated in the liberation of Prétot. Dominique Francois a Historian who lives in Picauville, close to Prétot, has just published a book which recounts the history of the 508.

Before he died, Colonel Mendez wrote the preface to the book.

Dominique, for many years a friend to men of the 508 who return to Normandy to observe D-Day conceived the idea of commemorating Colonel Mendez. He explained, "The people of Normandy are different from the Parisians. In Normandy the Americans are venerated."

Harry Roll named Paratrooper of the Year by 82nd Airborne Chapter.

Ben Beekmaan, National President of 82nd Abn Association presented Harry with a plaque bearing the sculptured likeness of General Ridgeway at the Annual dinner in Dayton, Ohio.

Nate Silverlieb, B Co was honored as Veteran of the Year in Holyoke, MA .

At veterans Day services he was presented with Citations from Governor Jane Swift, the Mayor of Holyoke and from members of the legislature.

Zig Boroughs was guest speaker at the Pickens Middle School "Salute to Veterans" on November 11, 2002.

The school is cited as South Carolina's "First Palmetto's Finest School 2001-2002." Zig relates how the students interviewed local veterans, took pictures and put together a book entitled "**An Honorable Heritage**", which was printed by a local press. Student leaders presented copies of the book to the veterans. A historian in his own right, Zig provided this highlight.:

"I received a book produced by a History Class at Madera High School, Madera, California. It was sent to me by **Angelina Fuller, sister of Louis Spera, I Company, 508** who was killed at Fulbeck Airfield, England while loading bundles equipped with land mines for our aborted jump into Belgium in August 1944.

Angie met with WWII veterans who had a history club. She invited them to meet with High School students in her home. The students were inspired to publish the veterans' stories as a class project. "When Zig showed the book to Mr. Dean Holder, Principal of Pickens Middle School, he, in turn, showed it to teachers and students who rose to the challenge.

Starting in September, 2002 the students dug in and had the printed version of "An Honorable Heritage" ready for the Veterans Day Program. Zig says, "Lots of credit goes to Angelina (Spera) Fuller."

IN MEMORIAM

Walter (Walt) Silver, (C Co) died at home

October 29, 2002. Walt retired from Exxon after 50 years of service as an engineer .He jumped into Normandy on D-Day 1944 with the 508 Parachute Infantry Regiment He jumped into Nijmegen, Holland on September 17, 1944 with the 508 in Operation Market Garden He also took part in the Battle of the Bulge. David E. Thomas, Regimental Surgeon, Died October 23, 2002 in San Antonio, TX

A retired Brigadier general, he was buried with full military honors at Fort Sam Houston National Cemetery.

Dave joined the Medical Corps in 1939. He was the first Army medical officer to get his jump wings. He jumped into Normandy on D-Day, June 6, 1944 with the 508 Parachute Infantry Regiment. On D+4 he was captured by German troops and put to work in a front line hospital treating both German and American wounded. On D+7 he escaped and found his way back to American troops. He is credited with saving many lives through the exercise of his surgical skills. He was with the 508 in Holland and in the Battle of the Bulge.

During the Korean War, Dr. Thomas was chief of surgery at three hospitals in Japan He served as commander of the U.S. Army Medical Command in Vietnam. He was attending physician to President Johnson and President Eisenhower.

Dave Thomas was President of the 508 PIRA in 1977 . In recent correspondence, he wrote: "I've had a good life I've seen the world courtesy of Uncle Sam. I've spent five years overseas taking part in three wars. I've had a lot of fun, plenty of adventure, made friends with a lot of great people, saved lives, and led an active life. I will join my dear wife, Jeanne, with a smile on my face, knowing I made a significant contribution to our great nation."

Ray Costanzo, (I Co), Died Monday, August 19, 2002.

He jumped into Normandy with the 508 on D-Day. He was taken prisoner June 18, 1944 and treated for his wounds in a German hospital. He was liberated by advancing American troops and sent to England before returning to the United States for treatment.

Ray was awarded the Bronze Star with "V" for valor, the Purple Heart and the Combat Infantry Badge.

He was appointed Superintendent of Arlington National Cemetery and remained there until he retired in 1990.

On November 10, 1988 **President Reagan** presented him the newly created **Prisoner of War Medal.**

Ray Costanzo will always be remembered by his friends and comrades of the 508 for arranging a prized location in view of the Tomb of The Unknowns for the erection of a monument to the 508 surrounded by a grove of three Colorado blue spruce.

Colonel Louis G. Mendez, Jr. gave the dedication address in Arlington on October 1982 on the occasion of the 40th Anniversary of the Activation of the 508.
