

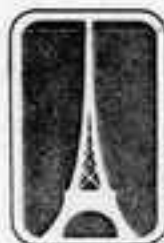

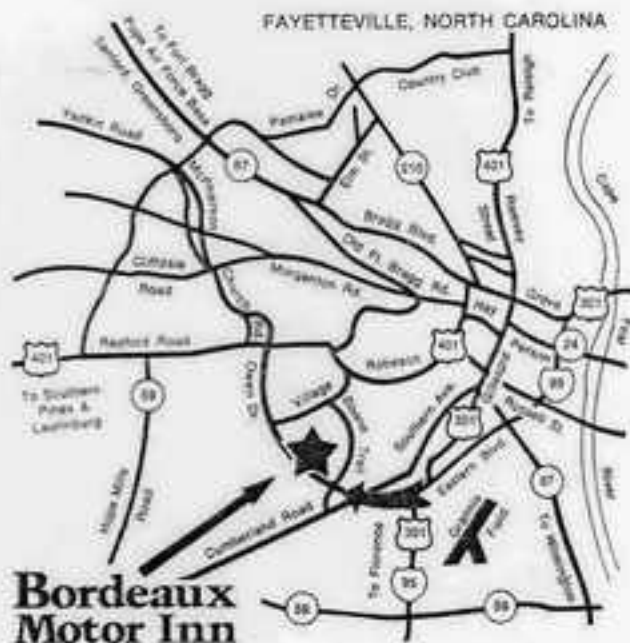

CHEF DU PONT PROJECT

Chef Du Pont was an experience not to be forgotten by the Normandy veterans and a name often heard by the troopers who joined the Regiment later. It is also a town in Normandy and it has been visited by many 508ers who return to the scenes of their W.W.II adventures. Everyone who was there in 1944 or who visited later will tell you it is 508th country! Many years ago the town erected a monument to the memory of the regiment who fought to save them from Nazi enslavement- our 508th Regiment!

In recent years, many of our men who have visited there have expressed the thought of doing something for the town. Not because something hadn't been done years ago but because of the hospitality and gratefulness shown by the Chef Du Pont townspeople towards the 508th visitors and because it would be nice. Rex Combs was one of those frequent visitors.

After the 1975 convention, Rex pursued the idea. When he queried the townspeople, he found that of all else, they would appreciate most a small garden or park between the present 508th memorial and the river. It would be especially appropriate because the area was being sought as a parking space for a nearby business. The cost would be approximately \$2,000.00 U.S.

The idea of a garden with suitable marker presented by our Association to compliment the present memorial was approved at the 1976 convention in Chicago. We have raised about \$900.00 so far. 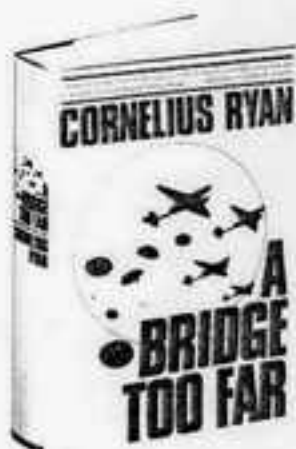
