1978 DENVER 1978

We are already receiving reservations and down payments for the 1978 Denver Reunion, so I had better get busy. Ed. Montgomery, Med. Co, was the first to register.

The shindig extends from Thursday Aug. 31, through Sept. 3, 1978. We are gathering at the Stapleton-Plaza Motor Hotel in Denver, Colorado, just 5 minutes from the airport and 10 minutes off of I70.

If you drive, there is underground parking with a complete security service. If you come by air, there is free transportation from the airport every 15 minutes.

The hotel is 11 stories high with 310 rooms. There is a party room on each floor and these will be Company CP's. Each room has an outside and inside balcony. Outside are the Rockies and inside is the atrium with lush plants and foliage and a water fall cascading to a pool 11 stories below. Each room has color TV, FM music, oversized beds, and individual temperature controls. Other hotel facil-

ities include sauna, steam bath, pool, whirlpool, track, movie theatre, liquor store, bank, barber shop, beauty parlor and specialty shops.

There is varied dining available within the Stapleton Plaza or at two hotels next door. The Plaza has a special menu for the adventurous which includes elk, buffalo, venison, rattlesnake, etc. If that doesn't turn you on, the traditional menus are available. There is a coffee shop and sandwich buffet also within the Plaza as well as a lounge with evening entertainment.

We are getting our rooms at a special rate of \$20.00 per night whether it is one or two people per room. This special rate is available to us also two nights before and two nights after the reunion.

ATTENTION TOUR GROUP

I was phoned this by O.B. at 12:45 A.M. Feb. 18. It's a special improvement in the tour. There will be 3 departure points for the same price. Los Angeles International, Chicago O'Hare, and New York Kennedy Airports. They will all arrive in Paris within 90 minutes of each other. All three flights will combine into the 508th tour group at this time and complete the tour together. These 3 departure points will save many people a lot of money. You will leave London for home on separate flights which will return you to the airport from which you departed.

When you send your deposit, indicate from which airport you wish to depart. Those who have already made a deposit, contact Jim Smith in Fayetteville with that information. You will be informed by O.B. or Don Lassen of your flight number and time of departure. You will get your tickets at the airport the day of your departure from a Charter Agent.

1978 DENVER REUNION 1978

Thursday August 31, 1978 through Sunday September 3, 1978 are the dates. Set them aside for another memorable get together. The place is the Stapleton-Plaza Hotel in Denver, Colorado, just 5 minutes from the airport and 10 minutes from I -70, per our Tom Heun, B & Service Co.-the 508th man on the spot. Tom works for the hotel!

Here's what Tom says; There is free transportation from the airport to the hotel every 15 minutes. The hotel is 11 stories with 10 for rooms. There is a party suite on each floor. Each company can have its own floor with a private party room included for CP. Each of the 310 rooms has a balcony facing outside and one facing inside to the atrium. The rooms have TV, oversized beds and individual temperature controls. Other amenities include sauna, steam bath (co-ed!) pool, whirlpool, track movie theatre, liquor store, bank, barber shop, beauty parlor and specialty shops.

Restaurants include the Open Season which features wild game or traditional menus, a coffee shop and a sandwich buffet. A bar features nightly entertainment. There are other restaurants nearby too.

Underground parking with complete security service is a part of the complex.

Rooms will be \$20.00 per night whether you have one or two persons. This is a special rate provided us by the hotel and is effective as well for two days before the reunion and two days after.

Tom says - come early and stay late. There's lots to see and do. In Denver, there is the U.S.Mint, Eisenhower Chapel, Museum of Science, Wax Museum, Art Museum, Old Town or Larimer Square, shopping, etc. Side trips can be made to Mesa Verde, Royal Gorge, Dinosaur Park, Dude Ranches, Gold mines, etc.
