

A recent decision by General Bernard Rogers, Chief of Staff, eliminates the beret as the approved headdress of Airborne troops. This decision affects all men of the 82nd Airborne Division, the 101st Airborne Division and men of the 509. Only the Special Forces and Rangers are unaffected by this decision.

The maroon berets of the 82nd and 509 and the blue beret of the 101st are an excellent way of identifying these men. They have worn berets proudly for many years. The decision to take away the beret is certain to have an adverse affect on the morale of these excellent soldiers. You, as an Airborne veteran, know how vital high morale is to any unit.

Airborne troops receive more vigorous training, are constantly on the alert and are recognized around the world as top-notch high spirited units. They are subjected to greater than normal dangers and are the first men called on in time of emergency or national crisis. They volunteer to be Airborne and should definitely be entitled to wear a distinctive uniform. I'm sure that most people will agree that Airborne soldiers are in a category all their own.

I cannot see any benefit to anyone from this decision to eliminate the Airborne beret. As a veteran Parachute Infantryman from World War II, I ask your support in returning the beret to all men of the Airborne. There can be no advantage to any decision that demoralizes so many fine men.

You can assist greatly in this effort by writing to President Carter and to the Senator and Congressman from your district. I ask all Airborne families and their friends to join us in this effort.
