
BUSINESS MEETING

508th MEMORIALS

We have 2 memorial projects underway. One in Holland, at Beek, just outside Nijmegen and one in Arlington National Cemetery in Washington, DC. Both will be dedicated to our Regiment and the men who served in it in WW II. The Beek Memorial will also be dedicated to the Dutch underground fighters who joined with us in the battles in Holland. This Holland memorial is a monument, designed by a Dutch artist. It will be installed by the City of Beek, and dedicated by our tour group Sept, 17, 1981.

The Arlington Memorial will be in 2 parts. A clump of trees with a dedication stone and bronze marker near the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, and a Memorial Plaque to be mounted in the Memorial Amphitheater. Artist sketches of this project will be shown in Daytona Beach. The Arlington Memorial will be dedicated by us in 1982 in Washington, DC just before the 1982 Convention opens. The presentation will be a formal military ceremony and open to all to attend.

Our memorial fund needs your support, no matter what it is. If everyone of us, could give \$5.00, we'd be in good shape. Our money in Holland is being matched dollar for dollar by the people of Beek.
