

Six Accidental Deaths Reported

By The Associated Press At least six persons lost their lives in accidents in Wisconsin during the week-and

ing the week-end.

Ned R. Peterson, 26, discharged naval veteran of Watertown, was killed last night when the car which he was driving left the road near Jefferson and struck a utility pole.
