Class Descriptions

FRG Essentials

This class will serve as an introduction to the Family Readiness Group (FRG). Students will review the FRG mission and determine how leaders can advocate mission readiness. A must-have class for FRG Leadership.

FRG Key Caller Training

Designed to prepare volunteers for key caller duties and how to communicate with Families.

FRG Treasurer Training

Critical training for any FRG member who manages the FRG's funds. Learn how to set-up and manage the FRG Informal Fund account in accordance with AR 608-1, Appendix J.

Care Team Training

By providing immediate support after official notification, the Care Team fills the gap between the notification team and Family support arriving. This training is critical prior to establishing a Care Team.

CDR FRG Training

This training is for RDC & Commanders and is based on the requirements of AR 608-1, Appendix J. The focus is on learning how to create and maintain an effective Family Readiness Group (FRG) in compliance with Army standards.

FRL Training

The training includes topics that cover understanding your role, resources for success, FRG Do's and Don'ts, and working with FRG Volunteers.

Super Saturday Training

This training encompasses four FRG trainings in one day. Those classes are the Treasurer Training, , Key Caller Training, FRG Essentials, and Care Team. You can pick and choose what classes you'd like to attend, whether one, two, or all four. Here is the agenda for this class:

Treasurer Training: 9:00am-11:00am

Key Caller Training: 11:00-12:00pm

FRG Essentials: 1:00pm-3:00pm

Care Team: 3:00pm-5:00pm
